pero también: play cards/poker/chess/board games

go

se usa para hablar de deportes que acaban en -ing

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go + sailing/cycling/skiing/snowboarding/swimming

do

se usa para hablar de deportes que se practican con el cuerpo y no requieren, generalmente, ningún otro elemento.

do + athletics/gymnastics/Judo/karate/yoga
pero también: do boxing
