stressing

- Stressing (VERB, present participle of stress): It is the continuous form of the verb stress. It is used to indicate the ongoing act of causing stress or emphasizing a particular point or concern. It implies an action or behavior that places emphasis, importance, or pressure on something.

She is stressing the importance of meeting the deadline. The teacher is stressing the need to study for the exam.
